Title I Assessments

- Assessments are used to help teachers determine if a student is understanding the content presented in the classroom.
- We use the following assessments for all of our students:
 - Curriculum Based Assessments
 - PAST, DIBELS, Running Records
 - *i*Ready

Proficiency Levels

 If a child does not reach a certain proficiency level when they take an assessment, we consider them for additional help from our Title I program.

PSSA Proficiency Levels

- Your child will be taking the Pennsylvania System of School Assessment (PSSA) in grades 3-8 and the Keystone Exams by grade 11
 - Four Proficiency Levels for the PSSA/Keystone Exams
 - Advanced
 - Proficient
 - Basic
 - Below Basic
 - Our goal (and the State's goal) is for your student to reach the "Proficient" level on the PSSA and Keystone Exams

Assessment Results

- You will be notified of your child's assessment results.
- Timeline:
 - PSSA Mailed home in the Fall
 - Keystones Approximately 8 weeks after administration
 - Report Cards Quarterly or Trimesters
 - Progress Reports Throughout the school year

 - Title I Reading Teacher
 - Principal

Parent's Rights under ESSA

- Teacher Qualifications
- Non-Highly Qualified Teacher for four or more weeks
- Request opportunities to meet regularly with staff for parent involvement
- Participate in decisions affecting your child
