# Updated based on DOH Guidelines from November 18, 2020

Elementary Level Mask Compliance (K-6): Students must wear a face mask at all times when indoors. Mask breaks may be provided when students are outdoors only. Masks may be removed indoors only when eating, with distancing and shields in place.

Elementary schedules have been modified so that students can take two mask breaks outdoors (one mid-morning and one early afternoon) each day, weather permitting. Students are encouraged to dress in proper attire and bring appropriate outerwear given the colder weather.

Elementary students who do not comply with Elementary Mask Rules will be in violation of the BASD District Dress Code Policy. Every effort will be made to work with our families to promote the health and safety of all faculty, staff, and students through proper mask wearing.

Noting our BASD Board Policy #221: Dress and Grooming:

The Board has the authority to impose limitations on students' dress in school. The Board will not interfere with the right of students and their parents/guardians to make decisions regarding their appearance, except when their choices disrupt the educational program of the schools or constitute a health or safety hazard.

Students may be required to wear certain types of clothing while participating in physical education classes, technical education, extracurricular activities, or other situations where special attire may be required to ensure the health or safety of the student.

The building principal or designee shall be responsible to monitor student dress and grooming, and to enforce Board policy and school rules governing student dress and grooming.
