

**Bloomsburg Area School District  
School Board Meeting Summary  
9 January 2023  
7:00 p.m.**

**Bloomsburg Area Secondary Complex Enhanced Learning Center & Zoom**

The following is a summary of the 9 January 2023 school board work session, which began at 7:08 p.m.

- School board members present were: Stephanie Andreacci, George Barron, Mark Decker, Jonathan Jones, Joshua Klingerman Sr. (present from 7:22 – 7:26 p.m.), Marianne Kreisher, and Eve Ralston. School board members absent were: Bryne Lewis and Leo “Joe” Yodock III.

- Bloomsburg Middle School students presented information on a food drive they coordinated in October. The students reported that they collected a total of 562 nonperishable food items, all of which were donated to AGAPE. (See photo at right.)
- Business Administrator David Marsiglio made an initial presentation on the 2023-2024 budget.
- The board read/discussed the following New Business items, all of which are to appear as action items on the 16 January 2023 school board meeting agenda:

- Approval of previous meeting minutes
- Approval of amending the term of Columbia-Montour Area Vocational-Technical School Joint Operating Committee member George Barron to a three-year term (from a four-year term)
- Acceptance of the following donations made to the district:
  - a monetary donation of \$700 to be applied to accounts of students qualifying for free and reduced lunch, made by Tim Wagner
  - Grinch Popcorn from Incredible Popcorn, which was distributed to K-5 Beaver-Main Elementary School during its holiday movie presentation on 20 December 2022, made by the Beaver-Main Elementary School Parent Co-op



- M&Ms, marshmallows, and paper for students in grades three through five at Beaver-Main Elementary School to make special treats for high school students during their Spread the Cheer event, made by the Beaver-Main Elementary School Parent Co-op
    - Gift bags, coloring books, crayons, and stickers for the Beaver-Main Elementary School Pay-It-Forward annual event, made by the Beaver-Main Elementary School Parent Co-op
    - 50 sets of hats and gloves to Beaver-Main Elementary School, made by Single Mothers Individually Living Empowered (SMILE)
  - Approval of the agreements between POWER Library and Beaver-Main Elementary School and Bloomsburg Middle School, as presented
  - Acceptance of the high bid of \$6,600.00, through Municibid, for the district's 1979 Massey Ferguson 425 with brush attachment
  - Approval of the out-of-state/overnight field trip request for qualifying students (TBD) to attend the Swimming and Diving State Championships at Lewisburg, PA from 15-18 March 2023, as presented

  - Approval of adding a revision to the district's special education plan to add an elementary emotional support classroom, to be located at W.W. Evans Elementary School
